

Convenor of two book Groups

A story of one of our long-term Tutors:

Ray is a living legend. Phillip Adams has called him "...a clever bugger" and Bruce Dawe says he is "...our finest poet of light verse." But who is this Ray Kelley?
Ray is the highly-respected convenor of two U3A Book Discussion Groups, having taken over from Judy Burns on 10 August 1989 – that is an amazing 24 years.

Current long-term members are Stephanie Comino (joined in July 1994), Dorothy McLeod (October 94), Carolyn Bush (March 95), Lenore Black (June 95), and Sybil Wyatt (February 98). There have been two groups since March 1994.

Meeting places have included a downstairs room of St Andrews Uniting Church hall, the former headquarters of the Queensland Writers Centre in Brisbane CBD's only remaining convict-built structure, the Commissariat Building overlooking the Brisbane River, the State Library of Queensland, Metro Arts in Edward Street, Brunswick Street, Travel House and the June Dally-Watkins Building both in Edward Street, South Bank, U3A Brisbane's 97 Creek Street premises, and to date the Catholic Centre's cafe boardroom again in Edward Street.

From 10 August 1989 until now there have been 265 meetings discussing almost that number of books - only a few books, e.g. Lucky Jim and Persuasion, have cropped up twice. Every meeting commences with the reading of a few poems – Ray's records show that the groups have read 800 poems or more, some, like limericks, being short ones.

In addition, each December members discuss a book of their own choice and Ray delights with reading some of his own poems.

For those who don't know, he is a published poet with two books to his credit,

"Flight to the Chookhouse Roof"

(C.Q. University Press, Rockhampton 1998) and

"Go, Lovely Nose"

(Five Islands Press, Carlton 2005).

Many of his poems have also been published in The Spectator.

Members of the two groups are constantly amazed at the depth of Ray's memory, always able to quote a poem or refer to a movie – all out of the blue.
