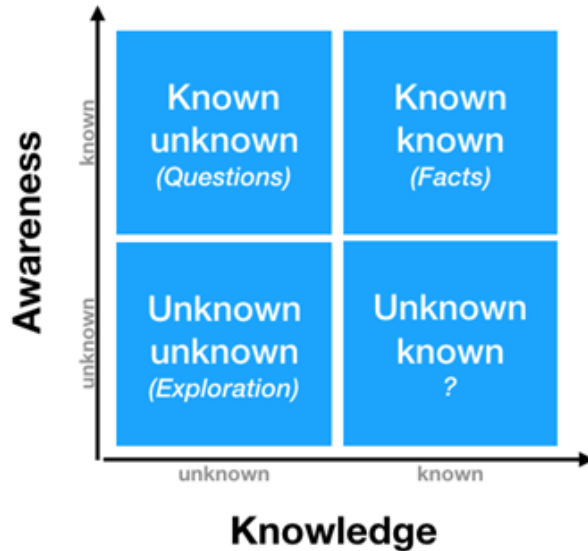
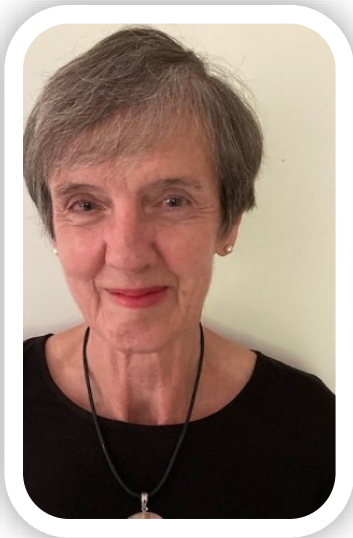




Editor's Notes

President's Message from Des Taylor

Hello all.

This is the final eNews for 2021. What a year it has been. We thought last December that by now we would be coming out of the Pandemic and everything would be as we knew it. Now we realise that we must “live with COVID” and take precautions for a very long time. U3A Brisbane are planning to return as close to our old ways as possible while still being cautious. Both Face-to-Face and Zoom classes will run in 2022.



In order to be able to ease restrictions in face-to-face classes we have introduced a Vaccination Policy in line with the Government mandate. Consequently:

- Classes can increase in size if the Tutor wishes.
- Classes that require extra time e.g. to see a complete movie can again run.
- Games that involve pieces e.g. Mahjong, Chess, Scrabble etc are again available.
- Masks are not needed in class (but we will follow current government advice on this and you should carry one at all times to use in crowds or confined spaces e.g. Bus).

The Social aspect of classes at U3A has always been very important. Now it is more important than ever when members' movement is restricted and travelling or visiting distant relatives has become difficult. With the current situation we still strive for this social contact. Many members who attend face-to-face classes still have a coffee or lunch after class with friends, but in a café or restaurant instead of in our venue itself. Zoom classes also often arrange to meet at an external venue to gain more personal contact with other class members. With both Face-to-Face and Zoom we still have the opportunity to meet people and make new friends. The rapport with your classmates is still there and builds over time. In addition, our Social Committee will again be organising events in 2022 and our popular monthly Zoom presentations will continue.

Remember it's important to use the *Check-in Qld* app when you arrive at a venue and to [link your Medicare or MyGov account to this app](#) prior to your arrival. This only needs to be done once. Once it is done then, when you use the *Check-in Qld* app, it will automatically give you the green bar of approval to show you are fully vaccinated. You will not need to disclose any other evidence to anyone. This protects your privacy. This system can then be used everywhere – cafes, theatres, sporting events, art galleries etc as well as U3A. If you also go to [Member Dashboard](#) on our website and tick to say you are fully vaccinated then enrolling in face-to-face classes and attending U3A venues will be as simple as we can make it while still following the government mandates.

You have all received information about our Class Schedule for 2022. There are some exciting new Tutors and classes available. I am once again spoilt for choice and have difficulty choosing. I hope you too will find much of interest for 2022.

If you haven't already renewed your membership for 2022, I would urge you to do it now. Our only sources of income are our Membership Fees and our Class Fees. Class Fees are still required to be paid in advance.

I'm hoping that the new Omicron virus can be controlled and that we can open our borders so that we can join family for Christmas. I wish all of you a safe and Happy Christmas.

Computer Classes in 2022

Maximise Your Investment in Your technology

Ever wondered how to maximise the value of your investment in technology? U3A Computer Classes can help.

Do you have a phone and/or tablet that uses the Android operating system (and this is most phones or tablets apart from Apple iPhones and tablets)? Want to find out how to get the maximum benefit from the investment you have made in your tablet and phone? If so, in Term 1 2022 Harry Gilman, one of U3A's experienced computer tutors, will be running a course that will lead you through the capabilities of Android operating system and the Google experience.

The course, **Android Phone/Tablet & Gmail**, will briefly go over some of Gmail's features and settings, then move to the Android system - making you aware of the important security needs for your device. You'll learn what Android is, how it works, apps in the Google Play Store, downloading and installing apps/widgets, and introducing you to other Google apps, such as: Google Keep, Google Calendar, Google Drive, Google Photos, Google Docs, Google Maps.

For those of us who have an interest in tracing our family history, U3A has a number of Computer Classes that can help you repair and organize your old photos, present a written story and make a presentation or video of your history.

Photoshop gives us the tools to repair and enhance these photos and store them electronically. Particularly important for all those old photos sourced as part of our family's history research, Computer tutor, Ben Lindeboom, has developed a structured series of courses for you to learn how to use

Photoshop Elements structured from **Beginner** onto **Advanced** and then to its more powerful stablemates **Photoshop CC**, **Adobe Camera Raw** and **Lightroom Classic**.

Once you have researched and written your family history, it is time to put your story together. **Microsoft Publisher** provides the tools you need to present your story. Jack Coad will lead you through Publisher to learn how to manipulate features such as page size, text, graphics, and borders. Publisher's strengths are in its ability to bring together text and images to make a professional looking publication. And of course, you will want to present the history you have put together to family, friends and maybe even family reunions. John Canny will teach you how to use **Microsoft PowerPoint** to prepare a presentation of your history using photos, text, diagrams, icons and the many other items you have found in your research. You can also convert your presentation to a video.

Face-to-face classes in all these subjects are available in Term 1, 2022. Some will also be available via Zoom. Check the Term 1 class schedule for details and to enrol in any of the courses.

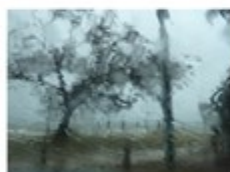

Leanne has been a member of U3A's Pencil and Charcoal Portraiture class during 2021. Here she shares her experience with us, with an example of what she has achieved.

Time to Learn New Skills

I joined the class towards the end of Term 3, initially to improve my knowledge and ability to draw portraits. I had been painting faces and bodies in my art class and was struggling to get the right proportions.

I found I have learnt a lot more about life drawing than simply that. Through Carol's guidance I have learnt skills about different ways of holding a pencil, about hatching and drawing positive and negative spaces; and I've been challenged with great homework exercises before each class.

During the class there is an opportunity to learn from each other by observing each person's process. Everyone has brought their own unique love of drawing to the class and it is a very positive learning experience.

I love the fact that others like me have loved art all their life and have rediscovered a passion for it in their mainly retirement years. This is a self-portrait based on a photo that was taken of me 42 years ago. I then went on to paint the face in oils and the preliminary work I did here certainly helped me to get the features right. It also shows that my hatching technique has greatly improved.
