A Wiki is a Collaborative Website which allows Content Development and encourages Collaborative Learning. It is ideal for Group Projects . Wikis encourage participation and communication.



Wikis



A wiki is typically a web application, which allows collaborative modification, extension, or deletion of its content and structure.

In a typical wiki, text is written using a built-in editor. You can join a Wiki or create one to share with others.

They can be Private or Public.

Wikipedia is a Public Wiki.
